



Hallington Beck, Louth - Practical conservation workday

Date : Friday 19th January 2018 – 10.30am – 2pm approx.

Details : This is a practical conservation work day in Louth, Lincolnshire. The aim of the practical day is to control bank side vegetation around a runoff pond that feeds into the beautiful Hallington beck near the popular park of Hubbards Hills.

Through management of the pond (that takes runoff from the road above) the hope is to reduce the risk of pollutants entering Hallington beck.

Please wear suitable clothing such as long trousers, long sleeved top and waterproofs the terrain is bumpy and there is a great deal of vegetation to get through! Suitable footwear is essential, either sturdy walking boots or wellingtons. Please bring packed lunch and a drink.

No previous knowledge or experience needed, just your enthusiasm!
